Councilman Amarante

- Stipends discussed three years ago, the idea resurfaced this year
- Finance Committee reviewed
- Borough Attorney Cipriani provided information regarding other towns Mayor and Council stipend
- Clerk Konopada provided a N.J. Municipalities survey back from 2019
- Stipend would be taxed to whoever choses to accept it
- The numbers discussed were \$2,500 per year for the Mayor, \$1,500 for Council members
- This falls within the lower range of most other towns.
- Bay Head currently at \$2,600 for the Mayor, \$1,600 for Council members
- Councilman Donaldson advised he would like to be classified as a volunteer and not receive a stipend
- Borough Attorney Cipriani responded that you are designated as an elected official. You can waive the stipend, and fill that role on a volunteer basis

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-15

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, SO AS TO AMEND CHAPTER 20, ENTITLED "SEWERS"

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Mantoloking, County of Ocean, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 20-3 of Chapter 20 of the Borough Code of the Borough of Mantoloking, entitled, "Sewers" is hereby amended and supplemented so as to read in its entirety as follows:

20-2.3 Connection Fees and Costs.

- a. All costs shall be borne by the owner of the premises served.
- b. The fee for connecting to the sanitary sewerage system shall be **one hundred (\$100.00)** dollars. This fee includes the fee for inspection of this connection.

SECTION 2. Section 20-5 of Chapter 20 of the Borough Code of the Borough of Mantoloking, entitled, "Sewers" is hereby amended and supplemented so as to read in its entirety as follows:

20-2.5 User Rates and Charges.

- a. All owners of improved premises subject to connection and who have not connected and paid shall pay a pro rated annual sewer charge. The pro rated charge shall be due and payable from the expiration of the six (6) month period and shall be paid in full not later than seven (7) months from the announcement of availability of connection.
- b.1. There are hereby established the following annual rates and charges to be imposed by the Borough for the use and service of the sanitary sewerage system:

The minimum charge per unit shall be three hundred forty dollars and seventy cents (\$340.70) annually. In addition to the minimum charge each user shall pay a fee of \$16.31 (sixteen dollars and thirty-one cents) per fixture for all fixtures over four (4) exclusive of the laundry facility and one (1) dishwasher.

- c. Each user shall be provided with an annual statement of the sewer charges. The annual sewer charges shall be due and payable on April 20th of each year and shall become delinquent unless paid within the ten (10) day grace period after stated due date of April 20th each year. Failure to timely pay the sewer charges will expose the property to a municipal lien sale. Delinquent sewer accounts shall accrue interest at the rate of 12% per annum.
- 2. The annual sewer charge based on the type of property shall be as follows: ("X" indicates one (1) unit)

- 3. In addition to the foregoing charges, any user who discharges toxic pollutants into the system which causes increased operations and maintenance costs shall be responsible for such increased operation and maintenance costs.
- c. Each user shall be provided with an annual statement of the sewer charges. The annual sewer charges shall be due and payable on April 20th of each year and shall become delinquent unless paid within the ten (10) day grace period after stated due date of April 20th each year. Failure to timely pay the sewer charges will expose the property to a municipal lien sale. Delinquent sewer accounts shall accrue interest at the rate of twelve (12%) percent per annum.

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall take effect after second reading and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-14

ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, ADOPTING THE REVISED AND RECODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING

WHEREAS, the present General Ordinances of the Borough of Mantoloking are in need of being revised and recodified; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Mantoloking has completely revised the General Ordinances to create a new Borough Code for the Borough of Mantoloking; and

WHEREAS, the complete revision of the General Ordinances of the Borough of Mantoloking has been filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and shall be open to inspection and examination by the public; and

WHEREAS, a copy of the revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Mantoloking shall remain on file with the Borough Clerk after final adoption and passage pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:49-4.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the governing body of the Township of Mantoloking, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. The Borough Council hereby adopts the revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Mantoloking.

SECTION 2. The revised General Ordinances shall be filed in the office of the Borough Clerk for the examination and inspection by the public until final action is taken on the revised General Ordinances, and that said copy of the revisions shall remain on file and be available for purchase after adoption.

SECTION 3. That by the adoption of these revised General Ordinances, the previous General Ordinances of the Borough of Mantoloking, as set forth in the Borough Code of the Borough of Mantoloking, are hereby repealed in their entirety; except for the chapters entitled "Site Plan Review" and "Zoning."

SECTION 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall take effect after second reading and publication as required by law.

Councilwoman Benz proposed 3 changes be made at the table:

- -Received feedback from FEMA, regarding the flood chapter, Chapter 16-2.3, paragraphs 1,4 & 5 they have requested that at the end of each of those paragraphs the phrase (whichever is more restrictive) be added.
- -Another note, we in tandem to moving forward with this ordinance are requesting, and Larry is pursuing this, that the language surrounding the designs standards for fencing in coastal A zones and the velocity zones be removed, along with the references to onsite septic systems which of course do not exist in Mantoloking.
- Larry is pursuing the buyoff from Fema on removal of that language. If and when they approve it, we will then move forward with a change to the ordinance at that time.

CONSENT AGENDA

All items listed are considered to be routine by the governing body and will be approved by one motion. If separate discussion is desired, the item will be removed from the Consent Agenda and considered separately.

Councilwoman Benz had questions on three resolutions:

Res. 24-50 - who is purchasing through this cooperative and what are we purchasing. Chief Ferris explained

sometimes state contracts can be beaten with co-ops. We belong to several of them. We are interviewing and working with a technology company that could replace 3 other companies we are currently using for interlock devices, recording equipment, cameras in the building.

Res. 24-61 — grant funding will go towards purchasing sand waste stations, and supplies with one response vehicle. Chief Ferris responded she is writing grants, one is a DCA grant, we were thinking out of the box for anything to use potentially on the beach. This would be a smaller pick up truck proposing in the grant for maintenance and for response to the beach. This would allow for patient removal, debris removal, equipment and maintenance getting things back and forth. DCA said other towns have submitted for this.

Res. 24-62 – number 2 of the resolution that the borough accepts cost shared payments as outlined in the agreement. How does this work if terms of cost share payments? Borough Administrator Radi responded 4 year agreement, the first year they pick up entirely, then a match over the next 3 years total out of pocket will be \$1,579. Our IT consultant, Freehold IT, that it is a well discounted price for that level of security. Councilman Amarante added this replaces something that we currently paid for -yes. Freehold IT brought us this grant. We are getting better coverage. Borough Administrator Radi -This grant comes from the Office of Homeland Security. This platform we are switching to is highly recommended and is a good fit for the Borough.

Borough Attorney Cipriani - requested a small change in Resolution 24-63 be made should read Shared Service Agreement, not Interlocal Agreement

Councilman Conti asked that Resolution 24-55 be pulled from the consent agenda for further discussion.

- 2024 cost \$190,000 Next year (September -September '25) it will be \$197,000. Asked that we remind residents about snow and ice safety issues, keeping debris free of the area where the workers need to walk
- A reminder will be sent out to residents regarding snow and ice and encouraging residents to bring cans to the curb.
- Republic Services will no longer be bidding on any contracts that requires back door services
- Bay Head back door service costs increased 66% to \$348,000 in 2023 with back door service and they do not have recycle pick up
- The Borough is looking at a significant price increase unless we mitigate in some manner with what we are asking to be bid on.
- Councilman Batcha expressed that this is a great service to have and might be worth the premium

• Borough Administrator Radi - Industry wide, the shift is away from back door collection, with progression to robo cans. The fleet of garbage haulers are moving towards procurement of robo cans.

Moving toward on line property tax and sewer payments

- expecting to go live sometime in May/June
- Going into agreement with Edmunds for their Wipp Program
- Need to be set up as a vendor/merchant to participate in the credit card payment system

Records Management

- 2023 the Borough received permission from the State of N.J. to destroy 156 boxes of records
- 2024 we have received permission to destroy 25 boxes to be shredded tomorrow.
- Outside company coming to shred boxes
- Summer intern will work again this summer from June through August assisting in the Construction Department answering phones and be a floater where needed.

Finance-Chairman Anthony Amarante

- Finalizing the 2024 budget, planning to introduce in March.
- Long term thinking: replenishing reserves.
- Will be using a good amount of reserves for the Bay Avenue Project that is not covered by the grant.
- Barnegat Lane Project coming up, hopefully should not be too much in excess of what we received as a grant.
- Continuing future flood mitigation needs.
- Look at ways to replenish those reserves without taking a big hit to the tax rate.

Councilman Conti had a discussion with Mayor White and Chief Ferris regarding speed humps on Barnegat Lane.

Chief Ferris

- Only interact with those residents in which the speed humps will directly impact to the north and south.
- A lot of misinterpretation of the program.
- Speed humps at their peak they are no more than 3" high, gradual rise, Public Works will be able to plow over them, signs will be installed.
- Meeting with DOT before summer regarding speed limit.
- Surveyor completed measurements, the Borough should have the placement and exactly what the project will look like shortly.

Chief Ferris and Larry Plevier have had several meetings with residents who were opposing it and once we went over the specific dynamics and dimensions and what they looked like and asked them to go to other communities, it seemed like they had resolved any negative thoughts they had towards the project.

Councilman Conti -Is the incremental benefit worth the risk that somebody gets hurt. We do not have a speeding problem, we have a volume problem. There is budget issues, efficacy is questionable and the safety is questionable. Chief Ferris noted that Police have never been called for service for anyone injured hitting a speed bump.

Councilman Donaldson -spend money putting a sidewalk in and get pedestrians off the road. Chief Ferris does not think the road is wide enough.

Mayor White this is a very difficult problem to solve. Lowering the speed, speed humps and hopefully, a combination of things will add up to a good result. We are lucky we have not had more accidents and injuries than we have. This is a way to do everything in our power to make this very difficult road a safer place for all of us to be.

Councilman Amarante – even though report said there was not a speeding problem, it did recommend putting the speed humps in. Bike pathway and taking Barnegat Lane off the apps as an alternative route, hope we can go that route.

Councilman Batcha – inquired about the dimensions of Barnegat Lane right away for the street. Is it the same north and south of Lyman. Councilwoman Benz noted one is wider than the other and have sidewalks.

Land Use-Chairman Brad Batcha

Flood Committee put together:

- The committee met twice and had very good meetings
- Councilman Conti been running the meetings
- Larry Plevier and Bob Mainberger are also in attendance
- Gathered a lot of data from the engineering firm, maps shared with the Committee
- Made progress and will be making recommendations that relate to check valves and bulkheads and reintroducing our ordinance next month relating to bulkheads.

Councilman Conti

- Divided the projects into short term and long term getting started on the short term projects
- Identified some of the check valves as a problem on Old Bridge and Clayton
- Larry Plevier introduced the idea to put a check valve at the storm sewer rather than replacing check valves in the bay. That would eliminate the need to replace the pipe, quicker and a lot cheaper.
- Proceed with replacing check valves that are leaking, 2 or 3 this year
- Bulkheads will be installed at Albertson and Arnold
- Larry Plevier is applying for the permits now and providing with committee with an estimate
- The biggest issue is the Yacht Club Bulkhead which is 3 feet. If there was a 3 1/2 foot storm it would be coming over the transom
- Town hall will flood no matter what is done unless the Yacht Club raises its bulkhead a foot and a half

Scott Hulse

• Schedule C meeting on March 12th – We will see what they have to offer. Chief Ferris noted that the county offers numerous services. There are resources that are not being utilized such as crosswalks

Councilman Conti- Sewer

- Pipe infiltration. Any pipe you put in the ground with the ground water will leak.
- Councilman Amarante had an idea that we go back and look at bills for the sewer.
- We had a very wet fall last year and that caused a big overage in our sewer usage. We used considerably more sewer capacity than in 2000, which suggests leaking pipes.

Scott Hulse

- Called Ocean County Utilities for January flow rate, we had 3 flooding events in town. Broke out rainfall for that period of time We were over 7.2 million gallons, that is the highest from 2020. This was the last flooding compared to the Storm Irene.
- Water could be going through the manholes into the sewer system

- All towns had these issues on the barrier island
- This year we will put money towards cameras instead of cleaning in October. Sealing manhole covers may be of some benefit too and not a huge cost. Address this in the upcoming year. The ground water is coming in the pipes

Councilman Amarante

- Suggests doing some camera inspections.
- Sealing the manhole covers may be of some benefit

Public Safety-Chairman Joseph Celentano

- Meeting every two weeks
- Ongoing training been going on
- Speed humps
- Cross walks
- Dogs on the beach, some people not cleaning up after their dogs
- Putting up more stations, bags and garbage cans
- Quality of life that has to be addressed

Mayor advised that this is a problem, should this continue the Borough will require leashes on dogs.

Public Works-Chairman Frank Donaldson

- Friday the pipe for the Bay Avenue project will be delivered
- Will be using 4 to 5 parking spaces by the Yacht Club
- Start dewatering next week

Councilman Donaldson requested not to overload Larry Plevier while at the Borough Hall as he is very busy when he is here.

Recreation-Chairman John Conti

- Chief Ferris discussed the 2024 beach season
- Brochures are done
- Presales of badges starting April 1, 2024 through Memorial Day sale price \$110 per badge
- People can order them on line
- Looking for employees for summer season
- New life guard station
- Restricting use of South Beach Badges- cannot use them on the 14 walkways
- Saturday, June 3rd badges increase to \$120

MAYOR, COUNCIL AND ADMINISTRATOR COMMENT

Councilwoman Benz inquired if there was financing in 2024 for the Mantoloking Annual Town Brochure for residents to which she was informed, yes.

Councilman Celentano acknowledged Councilwoman Benz efforts this past year and a half. He further noted the amount of work she has done and that she has done an amazing job.

PUBLIC COMMENT

J.L. Barnegat Lane made a request to assess all town owned bulkheads at the street ends, their height, conditions and if they need to be replaced anytime soon. Councilman Batcha responded they are doing exactly that.
